Meanwhile we are here and that is all that matters. Just being here has its own merits. . . making a few negatives is only icing on the cake!!!









JB & Susan FROM THE ROAD 12/11/2017



Below are a few more snapshots of our last few days. Enjoy, and as always, thanks for traveling along with us!











JB & Susan FROM THE ROAD 12/23/2017


